Covid-19 Pass Guidance

From Wednesday 15 December, the NHS Covid Pass on the NHS App will become mandatory for entry into nightclubs and settings where large crowds gather. You can get an NHS COVID Pass digitally through the NHS App, available on iOS or Android or the online <u>NHS COVID Pass service.</u>

To get a digital NHS COVID Pass for domestic events and venues, you need ONE of the following:

To be fully vaccinated with a COVID-19 vaccine used in the UK

The NHS COVID Pass is usually available 2 weeks after you're fully vaccinated.

A negative PCR test or negative lateral flow test within the past 48 hours

The NHS COVID Pass is available as soon as you get your result. You can collect lateral flow tests from receptions on College Lane and De Havilland or order lateral flow tests to home from <u>here</u>. If you did a rapid lateral flow test at home, you need to report the result first.

Find out how to report a rapid lateral flow test result.

A positive PCR test within the past 6 months

The NHS COVID Pass is available after you've finished self-isolating and up to 180 days after taking the test.

A confirmed medical exemption from COVID-19 vaccination or testing

The NHS COVID Pass is available once a doctor, clinician or midwife has approved your exemption application. COVID-19 medical exemptions: proving you are unable to get vaccinated (GOV.UK). We are unable to accept a lanyard or exemption card as proof of exemption.

Vaccinations overseas

If you live in England and had your vaccination overseas in certain countries, you can ask to have this added to your NHS vaccination record, more information can be found <u>here</u>. Once it's added you can get an NHS COVID Pass.

COVID-19 vaccine trials

If you were vaccinated as part of an official clinical trial in England or Wales, you can get an NHS COVID Pass for domestic events and venues.
